Maneka D. Brooks (PhD, Stanford University) is an Assistant Professor of Reading Education at Texas State University. Dr. Brooks' work as an educator and researcher focuses on creating more equitable schooling environments for students who remain classified as English learners for all or most of their educational trajectory. Her research with this population of students, who are often referred to as long-term English learners, has been published in *Research in the Teaching of English, Language and Education, Linguistics and Education*, and other venues.
